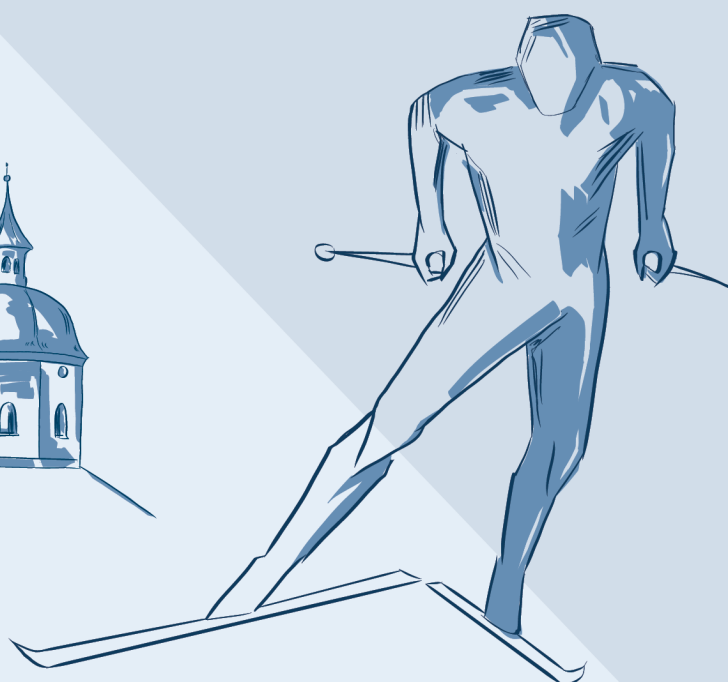

NEWS, FACTS & FIGURES

DEBUT FOR WOMEN'S TRIPLE

After 2 years of 2-day women's events, 2025 will also see the first women's triple! Much to the delight of last year's winner **Ida Marie Hagen**: „I think this change is really good! We train all year to compete and want to compete more so this is all we have wished for.“ **Lisa Hirner**, Austria's greatest medal hope, also sees this step in a positive light: „It's another good and important step for our sport. I really enjoy being in Seefeld, so I'm looking forward to competing there one more time this year.“

NEUES FORMAT SOLL FÜR MEHR SPANNUNG SORGEN

In order to provide even more excitement, especially on the last day of the competition, there is a new format for this year's triple! For the first time, there will be a mass start on Friday, followed by ski jumping. The run times achieved will be converted into points, with one minute behind in the run equating to 15 points. A 4-second deficit on the cross-country track corresponds to a one-point deficit for the jumping competition (the run winner receives 120 points). On the ski jump, the respective point deficits can then be made up with the corresponding distances.

An 'individual compact' format will follow on Saturday. This was also introduced to reduce the gaps. Normally, the jumps are awarded the usual points and whoever has the most points goes first on the track and is chased by everyone else. This is also the case with the Individual Compact, but instead of points there is a fixed time interval. This means that it doesn't matter whether you have jumped ten metres further than the runner-up or only half a metre. The first-placed athlete starts at 0 seconds, followed by the other athletes with fixed time gaps that get smaller and smaller towards the end. For example, the second-placed athlete from the jump starts exactly 6 seconds after the first-placed athlete and the third-placed athlete starts six seconds later. The gap between 9th and 10th place at the start is then only 2 seconds. The whole field is thus kept closer together, which should make for much more excitement. The Athletes themselves see the changes as very positive. Last year's third-placed Stefan Rettenecker: „I think it's a very good introduction, as a good performance from the previous day will be rewarded more fairly again(...).“ Olympic champion Vinzenz Geiger also has a lot to gain from the new approach and wants to build on a very successful season so far in Seefeld: „I find the compact format very exciting. But I've always performed well in Seefeld. There should be 7 podium places by now and of course there should be more to come.“

NORDIC WINTERPARTY

Regardless of who comes out on top this year, this year's triple weekend will be a celebration! On Saturday 1st February in the Kurpark Seefeld. The Plateau invites you to the Nordic Winterparty including a big Ö3 disco. After the opening by the young music band Jusic Sounds at 16:00 and the spectacular demonstration by the Taekwondo Club Seefeld, the children's programme starts at 16:30. From 17:30 the party really gets going when the Ö3 disco heats up the Kurpark. The official part starts at 19:15 with honours from the municipality of Seefeld, followed by the official award ceremony of the Nordic Combined Triple World Cup. The award ceremony is followed by an electric performance by the party band ZWIRN. From 22:30, all fans of the Nordic combined will party into the final triple day with DJ Kayce.

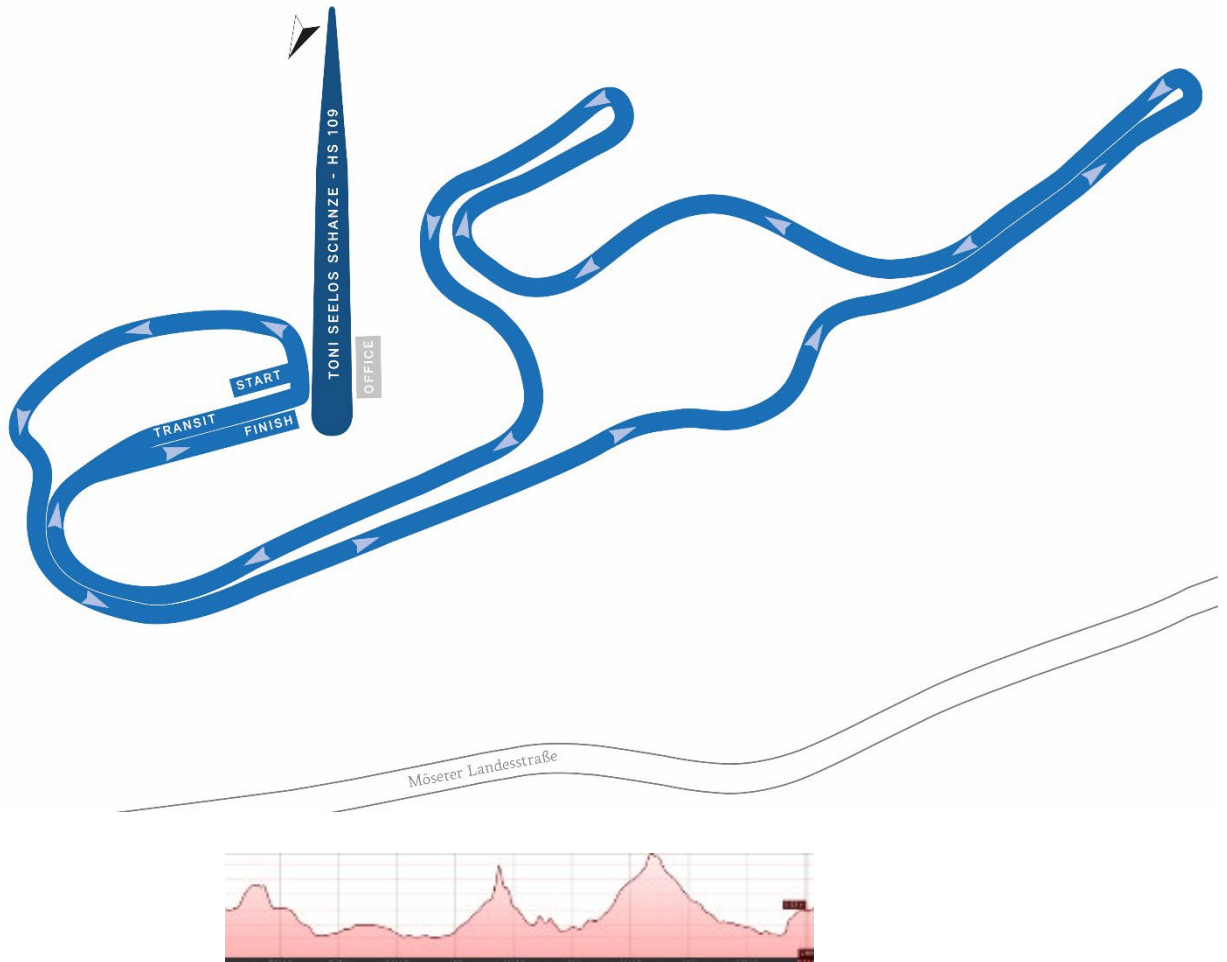

- Five villages: Seefeld, Leutasch, Mösern, Reith, Scharnitz
- Surface area: 320 km²

- Arrival: The region has three railway stations and a bus system with six lines. Innsbruck airport is 20 kilometres away
